ITEM #1 Call to Order.

Chairman Sheila Murray called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

ITEM #2 Approval of minutes

Sheila Murray asked for a motion to approve the minutes of the December 1 meeting and asked for discussion. Hearing no discussion the minutes were approved as published.

ITEM #3 Discussion on community concerns

A resident of the community brought up concerns over ATV and motorcycles at Heritage Park after hours especially on Saturdays. This information was sent to the patrol division to address. Eric Harris brought up a recent suicide by a 16-year-old, and asked the department to put out information to the community regarding securing firearms in the home. This information was referred to crime prevention. Pat Jones asked if vandalism at Krug Park was like it used to be and was informed it was not currently an issue. Dennis Dornhoffer asked about the recent shooting, and was informed of the preliminary information.

ITEM #4 Interaction with Police Department

Chief Connally provided his update on crime statistics. Apart from aggravated assaults crime is down. Chief Connally provided information regarding the addition of a second Community Mental Health Liaison to provide coverage in the evening hours. Chief Connally also discussed initiatives being developed with CAP and Interserve to provide field level response to homeless individuals. Chief Connally updated the group on our community partnership efforts including the Citizen's Academy, the resumption of neighborhood watch groups, and our recent human trafficking operation. Chief

also presented information regarding current legislation that could impact the city and the department and asked the group to reach out to their representatives in Jefferson City.


